


## Interacting with a First Responder



A first responder is a person who helps people stay safe.




They might be police, fire rescue workers, or emergency medical technicians (EMTs). Usually, first responders wear uniforms to help us identify them.




I might see them in my neighborhood.




## Interacting with a First Responder



Sometimes, a first responder might come to my house or school.




I might know some first responders, or they might be strangers.




I don't need to be afraid of first responders even though they are strangers.




## Interacting with a First Responder
