

What is Autism?

It is defined by a certain set of behaviors and is often referred to as a “spectrum condition” that affects people differently and to varying degrees.

Autism Spectrum Disorder

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) is a complex, lifelong developmental condition that typically appears during early childhood and can impact a person’s **social skills, communication, relationships, and self-regulation**. The Autism experience is different for everyone.

While there is currently no known single cause of Autism, early diagnosis helps a person receive resources that can support the choices and opportunities needed to live fully.

Autism Signs & Characteristics


- Repetitive behaviors, movements, or phrases
- Lack of response to normal stimuli (i.e. their name, visual cues)
- Atypical verbal communication or nonspeaking
- Difficulty understanding or expressing feelings
- Avoiding eye contact

Facts & Statistics

Over 7 million individuals in the United States are on the Autism spectrum; Autism is the fastest-growing developmental disability in the U.S.

1 in 31 children are diagnosed with Autism.

Since 2000, the Autism prevalence rate has been consistently increasing from one in 150 to now one in 31.

39% of children with ASD have an intellectual disability, 23% are in the borderline range, and 40% have average to above-average IQ scores. 

Over the next decade, an estimated **700k to 1.1 million+ Autistic teens** will enter adulthood and age out of school-based services.
